The big PUMA event at the classic car show





Unlike small towns in Southern Europe, which exude a certain coziness and charming romance, small towns in Germany convey an impression of simplicity and solidity – a beauty that seems clear and transparent. Spending time there, you sense simplicity and down-to-earthness. The idyllic Hattersheim am Main is just such a small town: it is usually quiet and pleasant here. But once a year, when the big event – the classic car meet – takes place, car enthusiasts and tourists from all over the world flock here.

This year, the fiery passion for samba can be felt even more strongly in the small town.

The small town of Hattersheim am Main in the Rhine-Main region.

Hattersheim am Main, a small town in the Main-Taunus district of Hesse, is located in the Rhine-Main region. It is located at the center of the Frankfurt-Wiesbaden-Mainz triangle and is part of the Rhine-Main metropolitan area. From here, every major city in the surrounding area is easily accessible – Frankfurt Airport is even just a 10-minute drive away.

The charm of the small town on the Main

The town has a very long history; according to reports, people lived here even before the Christian era. However, Hattersheim officially became a town in 1970. A few years later, the districts of Okriftel and Eddersheim were incorporated. Since 1978, the town has officially been called "Hattersheim am Main," which refers to its location on the beautiful Main River.

Strolling through the city is easy to find peace. The brick-red roofs, the classic, fine buildings, and the smiles of the people on the street all radiate a quiet friendliness. Along the shady linden avenue, you'll find an Italianate water feature, completed in 1999.

This water basin is built in the style of the new water architecture (popular from the late 19th to the early 20th century) and incorporates many elements of everyday life from that era. Originally powered by a steam engine, the basin was later electrically operated. Since 2011, the basin has been bubbling daily at set times – not only for its beauty, but also to support water demand during peak times, when, for example, the Höchst Waterworks or Frankfurt Airport require more water.

Not far from the water basin is a very beautiful wooden sculpture garden, built in 1997. The entrance area features two wooden sculptures.

Small Town Festival - Classic Car Party

The end of May is the most popular time in this small town — it's when one of Germany's largest classic car events takes place. Every year, countless classic car enthusiasts from all over the country come here to celebrate this major event. Last year's classic car show featured around 2,800 vehicles from various eras and attracted nearly 70,000 spectators.

The 29th classic car show, "Classics of the Road," will take place from May 20th to 21st of this year. The theme of this year's event is "From Two-Wheeler to Automobile." This means that from bicycles and motorcycles to four-wheeled classic cars – classics from almost all eras will be on display here. For classic car enthusiasts, this event is an absolute must!

At the same time, there will also be a classic car parade. In orderly rows, historic vehicles will drive through the streets, accompanied by music, from Hattersheim to nearby Hochheim. You can not only get a glimpse of these rare treasures, but also experience them in action. For a brief moment, you'll feel as if you've been transported back to another era.

Back to the old days – you'll taste the special charm of the alternating eras and styles. Some die-hard car enthusiasts will be able to expertly present, evaluate, and compare various classic cars – and you'll learn a lot in the process.In addition to the classic cars, there are many other activities this weekend reminiscent of a folk festival. In the spring sunshine, people will enjoy good food and wine and celebrate the major annual event. To support the festival, the shops will remain open as usual and even offer special promotional items and special offers, so that visitors can go home with full bags and in a good mood.

At a festival like this, children, of course, shouldn't be left out. As every year, there are carousels, bouncy castles, giant slides, and colorful balloon pools; everything is prepared well in advance and just waiting for the children. There will also be children's bike races and scooter competitions. The winners on Sunday afternoon even receive a trophy.

Highlight of the event – The PUMA Meeting

The vehicles on display are all unique, some even extremely rare – for example, this year's display will feature an early Spider from 1972. Only 153 examples were built back then.

A highlight of the event is the PUMA Sports Car Meet – an integral part of the classic car scene. This year marks the 20th PUMA Meet, held as part of the event.

According to reports, there are currently only around 80 PUMAs in all of Germany. Nearly 30 of them will be gathered at the meet in Hattersheim.PUMA is a brand steeped in legends – the only Brazilian sports car brand. The history of PUMA is also the history of Brazilian racing cars. The brand was founded in 1964 by an Italian immigrant who was also a landowner and lawyer.

Italian Genaro Rino Malzoni founded PUMA in Brazil. Since then, PUMA has continued to produce impressive creations. The streamlined body made of fiberglass-reinforced plastic, the cleverly positioned rear engine – all of this has captivated many car enthusiasts.

PUMA's greatest characteristic is that it draws on the strengths of many brands. Some say that PUMA is Brazil's Corvette, Porsche, Jaguar, Mustang, and Ferrari all rolled into one – you can see influences from all of these brands in PUMA vehicles.

The PUMA model, produced in 1964, was based on a DKW chassis. Later, it was given a sportier design and became an eye-catcher on the streets. From 1968 onwards, PUMA used the VW modular system, and VW remained the basis until 1977. Then PUMA launched the GTI two-seater coupé, which closely resembled the Ferrari 246 Dino and is now considered a classic among PUMA sports cars.

The GTI disappeared for a time due to the closure of the PUMA factory. Production only resumed when the company came under the umbrella of ALFA Metais Veiculos. However, production of the PUMA GTI was finally discontinued in 1995.

PUMA places particular emphasis on driving pleasure, which is why the vehicles are built low, the overall weight is relatively light, and the equipment is kept very simple – without any of the luxurious comfort features that are common today. Anyone who likes PUMA will get their money's worth in Hattersheim this year.

Background information on the journal Epoch Times

The Epoch Times is a multilingual, international magazine based in New York, associated with the Falun Gong group and the New Right in the United States. [From 2005 to 2012, it was published as a print weekly newspaper, also in German, initially under the name Die Neue Epoche, and from August 2007 under the name **Epoch Times Deutschland**.

It consisted of 20 pages. From 2012 to 2021, it was published as a purely electronic newspaper, and since 2021, it has again been available as a print newspaper by subscription.

History

The Epoch Times Germany is part of the international Epoch Times Group, which was founded in 1999 in New York by activists close to Falun Gong, with the publication of the Chineselanguage newspaper Da Ji Yuan, in response to the suppression of Falun Gong and the associated media censorship in China.

Da Ji Yuan (Chinese for "Great Epoch") reports in Chinese, in addition to general daily press content, on topics of interest to the Chinese people. Within just a few years, Da Ji Yuan has developed into one of the largest Chinese-language weekly newspapers outside of China, with a worldwide circulation of around 1.5 million copies. Currently, print and online newspapers from the Epoch Times Group are published in 36 countries and in 24 languages.

The German edition focuses on the sections Germany, International (with a focus on China), Business, People & Opinions, Knowledge, Culture, and Lifestyle. The printed newspaper has been available by subscription since 2021. Since the end of February 2025, Erik Rusch has been a member of the Federal Press Conference as a journalist for Epoch Times Germany.
